Camping Guidelines - Camping originally was only for our 8th - 12th graders, but we are allowing 6th & 7th graders to camp as well, just as long as a youth member's parent is camping with them. We would suggest that if you are camping that you plan on staying the entire week. We understand that it may be hard with work or sports games, but in order to get the most out of the Missions Week experience we would encourage kids to make that commitment. (Sports Example: we don't mind if you leave for a game, but would encourage you to not leave for practice that week) For those not camping, they are encouraged to stay at campsite after work day and dinner for time of games and fellowship and for campfire devos, but then head home around 9:00 P.M. each evening.
